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Search for an Address

To use the address search:

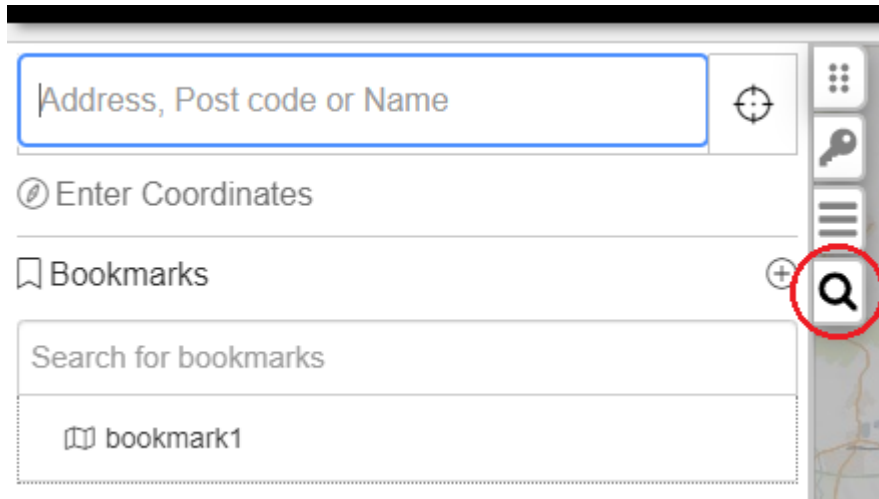


Figure 1: Address Search

1. Click the Magnifier (circled red in Figure 1).

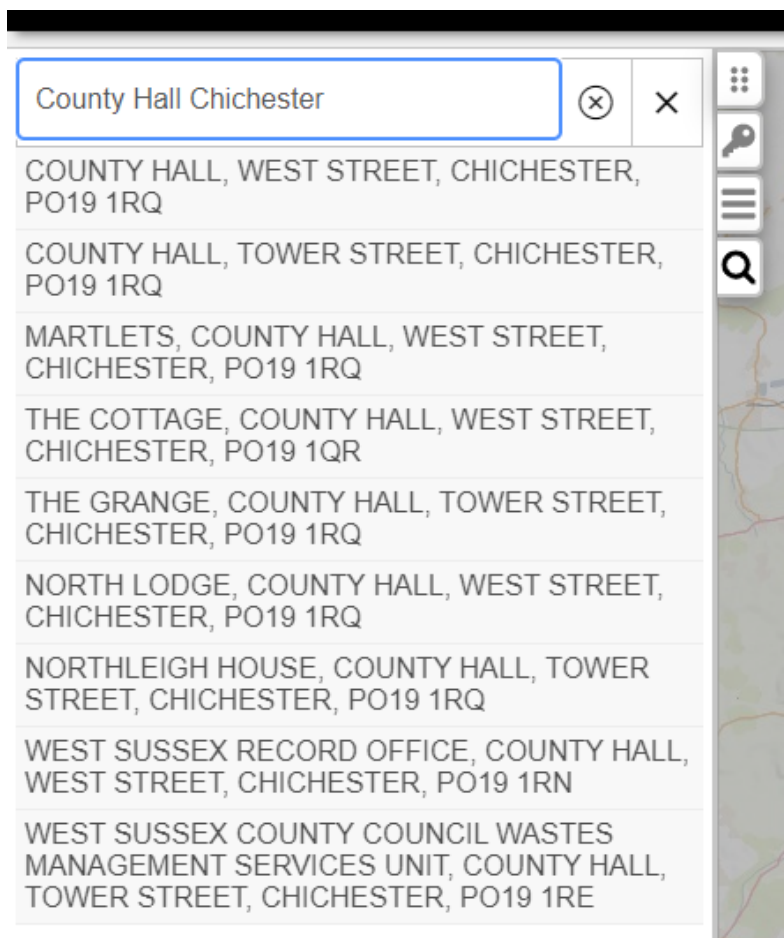


Figure 2: Search results

2. Enter address details – results will appear as you type (Figure 2).

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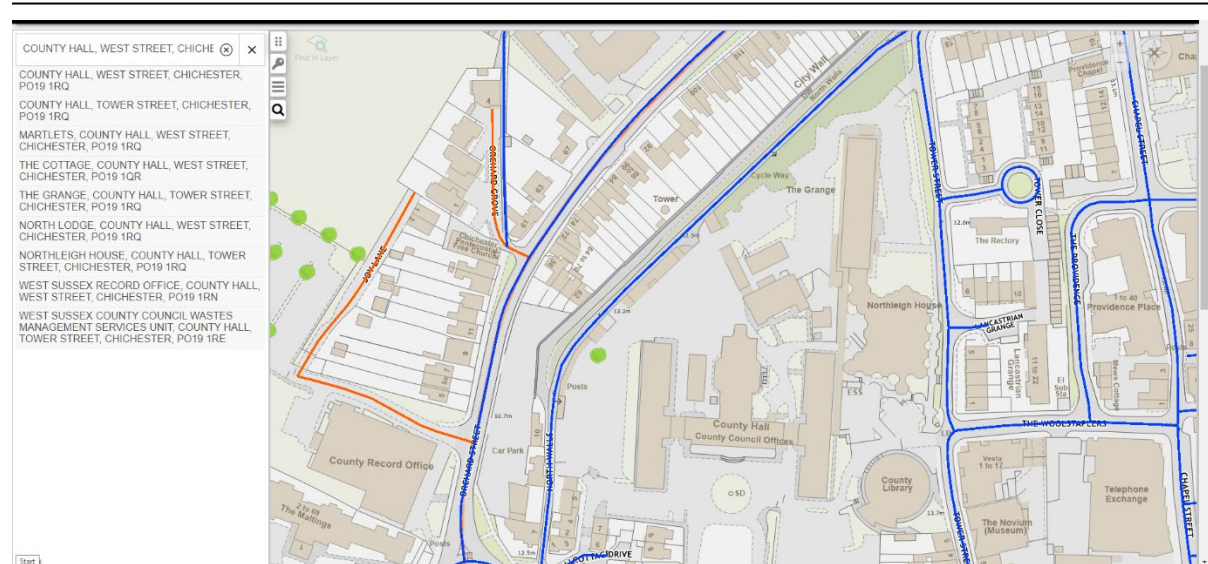


Figure 3: Select an address to zoom to that location

3. Select the required address. The map will zoom to that location (Figure 3).

Find Out whether a Road Is Adopted

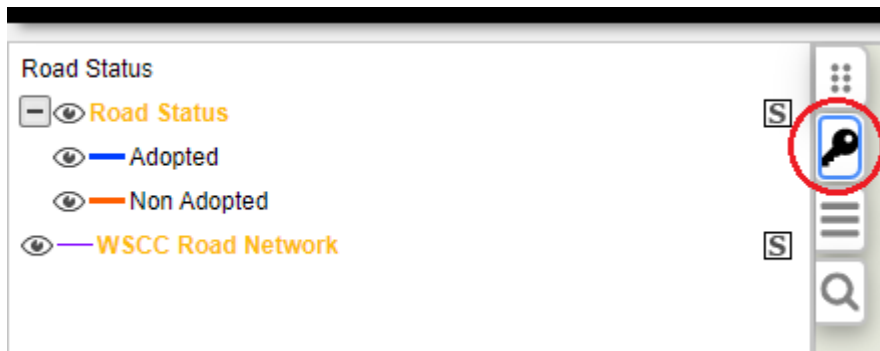


Figure 4: Map Key

1. Click the Key (circled red in Figure 4) to display the layers available on the map.
2. Refer to the key to find out whether a road is adopted.

Viewing Information about a Road's Status

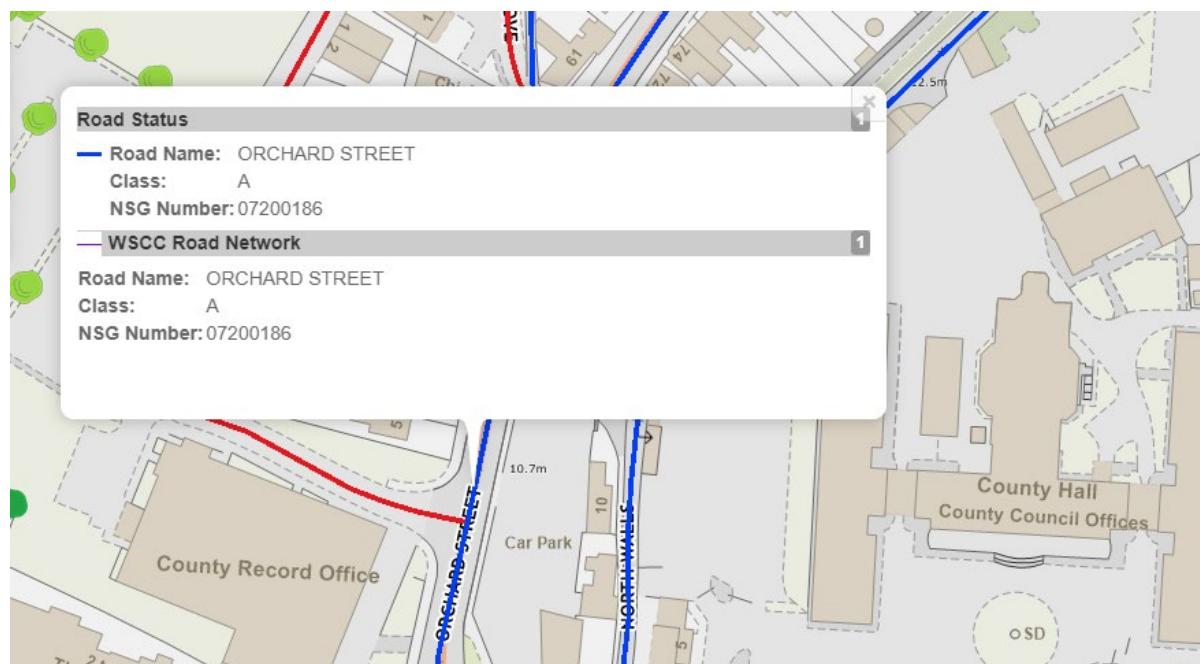


Figure 5: Viewing a road's status information

1. Click a road to display a pop-up box containing information about its status – see Figure 5.
2. Refer to Table 1 for the definition of each road class.
3. To close the pop-up, click the X in its top right corner.

Table 1: Definition of Class entries shown on Road Status information

Class	Definition
A	Principal or trunk road
B or C	Non-principal classified road
D	Unclassified road
E	Link footway
G	Green lane (limited maintenance)
M	Motorway
O	Other maintained road (limited maintenance)
P	Private street or private road
Q	Non-maintained road (new estates/private lanes)
R	Gatwick Airport road
T	Public right of way or track (limited maintenance) – part of the road network but not publicly maintainable highway. For public rights of way, this is only a graphical representation of where they are. For details and true definitive legal status, contact the County Council's Public Rights of Way Team on 01243 777620.

Tips for Using the Map Browser

To **navigate** around the map:

- Click and drag the map.
- Click the top, bottom, left, or right of the compass in the top right corner of the map (Figure 6) to move north, south, east, or west.

To **zoom in and out**:

- Click the plus (+) and minus (-) in the top right corner of the map (Figure 6).
- Use the mouse wheel.
