West Sussex Summary



New Businesses October 2024

- · 562 new businesses incorporated.
- 564 businesses dissolved or liquidated.

Claimants October 2024

- · Claimant count increased by 0.3% in West Sussex.
- Claimant count rate remained at 3.1% in West Sussex, staying below the regional average of 3.3% and national 4.4%.

Universal Credit Claimants September 2024

- Universal Credit claimants increased by 2.1% in West Sussex.
- Significant rise since March 2020 (167% increase).
- Higher increase than national (142%) or regional (154%) average.

Business Register Employment Survey 2023

- The latest data suggests that the number of employees in employment in West Sussex is 394,000, slightly higher than the pre-pandemic level in 2019 of 392,000. All local authorities in West Sussex have exceeded the 2019 levels of employees with the exception of Crawley.
- Over the last year, 2022-2023 there was a 4% growth in employees in West Sussex, higher than the average growth across England (1.4%) and for the South East region (1.3%). Worthing saw the highest % increase at 6.4% during the time.
- The highest percentage sector of employees in West Sussex, South East and England is in wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles with 15.2%, 15.0% and 13.7% respectively.
- Notable high sectors of employees are in human health and social work activities in Worthing (26.0%) and transport and storage for Crawley (23.6%).

Annual Survey of Hours and Earnings 2024 (Weekly Earnings)

- \cdot West Sussex has a lower resident (£746) and workplace (£720) median pay compared to the South East (£779 and £753 respectively).
- West Sussex has a higher resident median pay (£746) compared to England (£732) but a lower workplace median pay (£720 for West Sussex and £732 for England).
- Horsham currently has the highest resident median pay out of all district and boroughs in West Sussex at £822.
- Crawley has the highest workplace median pay out of all district and boroughs in West Sussex at £862.

Job Postings May - October 2024

- In October 2024 there were 18,494 job postings in West Sussex.
- In terms of the 'top' posted occupations over the last six months May'24-Oct '24 teaching assistants made up the highest number of occupations.

WSCC now has access to Lightcast from which the numbers of job postings by occupation type, along with other information including skills requirements and job titles are available. In October 2024 there were 18,494 job postings in West Sussex, a significant reduction from the peak in June 2023 of 38,650 but still higher than the general levels seen pre-Covid. In terms of the 'top' posted occupations over the last six months May'24-Oct '24 teaching assistants made up the highest number of occupations. Office/admin assistances, cleaners are also in demand.

- 8% of all businesses and 18% of businesses with 10 or more employees reported that they were experiencing worker shortages.
- 61% of businesses have some form of concern for their business.
- 14% of trading businesses reported they expect their overall performance to decrease over the next 12 months.
