High-Level Action Plan: 2025 - 2026

1. Overview

Set out below is the 25/26 high-level action plan for taking forward the West Sussex Economic Strategy ambitions and strategic priorities. The strategy is broad and long-term, and so actions will be prioritised and phased. There will be an annual review of progress when we will consider if the high-level actions remain the right ones. We will pause, adapt, or introduce new actions to ensure the work to achieve the strategy remains 'live' and up to date.

We will ensure broad engagement around the economic strategy and high-level action plan through communication activities, and will bring people together within existing structures and establish appropriate new ones (e.g. task groups) where this will add value. The action plan will be overseen by the West Sussex Economic Growth Board (WSEGB), established in 2024 as part of Government arrangements following the demise of Local Enterprise Partnerships. The WSEGB brings together leaders in business, local government, education, and health.

We have built the 25/26 action plan around: action areas with confirmed Government funding (green); action areas from current provision and commitments (blue); and new action areas for focus that need consideration and planning (purple).

In the first year we will also need to consider and respond to Government announcements including; <u>Sussex Devolution Proposal</u>; <u>Get Britain Working</u>; Department for Business and Trade SME Strategy and the <u>Business Growth Service</u>; <u>Skills England</u> plans, including for apprenticeships; reforms to the <u>Planning and Infrastructure bill</u>, including on affordable housing; and plans for the <u>UK Shared Prosperity Fund</u>.

2. High-Level Action Plan

The action plan sets out initial action areas and shows how they align to the Economic Strategy ambitions and strategic priorities. Each action area includes proposed key organisations to be involved, the funding source (where known), and targets to indicate progress. For ease of reference the ambitions are:

- 1. Boost productivity growth, investment, and innovation
- 2. Ensure a dynamic and skilled workforce
- 3. Boost green innovation, enhance natural capital, and support the transition to net zero
- 4. Deliver new development and infrastructure and maximise the benefits of our international transport hubs
- 5. Sustain our distinctive and vibrant places and grow the visitor economy

We will assess and measure progress of the strategy through tracking the implementation of the high-level action plan (as well as monitoring the overall indicators). We will monitor in 'narrative' terms progress against the high-level actions annually. We will also report on performance indicators relevant to key activities in the action plan.
