Summary of Universal Credit Claimants in West Sussex, November 2024

Overall:

- In November 2024, Universal Credit claimants increased by 2.3% (73,946 total) over the last month in West Sussex.
- Significant rise since March 2020 (170% increase).
- Higher increase than national (146%) or regional (157%) average.

Employment status:

- 44% of claimants were in employment in October 2024. Higher than national (38%) or regional (40%) average.
- Mid Sussex and Horsham had the highest percentage of employed claimants (46%).

District-specific:

- Mid Sussex had the highest percentage increase in claimants (195%) since March 2020.
- At November 2024, Arun had the highest number of claimants at 15,750.

Summary of the job postings in West Sussex by Lightcast.

WSCC has access to Lightcast from which the numbers of job postings by occupation type, along with other information including skills requirements and job titles is available. In November 2024 there were 18,444 job postings in West Sussex, a significant reduction from the peak in June 2023 of 38,650 but still higher than the general levels seen pre-Covid. In terms of the 'top' posted occupations over the last six months June'24-Nov '24 teaching assistants made up the highest number of occupations. Office/admin assistances, cleaners also continue to be in demand.
